Speakers: Professor **Chris Mowles** of the Hertfordshire University Complexity and Management Centre and Rev Dr **Terry Biddington**, Dean of Spiritual Life and Lecturer in Practical & Eco Theology at the University of Winchester; soul traveller and adventurer.

This workshop will explore the theme of working with emergent process and address the question ‘What is the quality of intelligence that is necessary to move things in the direction of a greater flourishing for all?’. The emergence of interiority as part of the process of cosmic evolution/awakening will be explored, as well as seeing religion as something that is unfinished and evolving, much as the universe is.
