Water is the central theme of the holiday and we'll be following its spiritual significance from the holy springs and lakes in the mountains down fast flowing streams and waterfalls to the rivers which wind through the landscape before finally meeting the sea. This holiday comprises spectacular mountain scenery of the Brecon Beacons National Park with a beautiful series of waterfalls - including the unique 'waterfall of snow' where the path takes us behind the water - along with the dramatic shoreline of the Glamorgan Heritage Coast from where Celtic missionaries sailed out to the rest of Europe during the Age of the Saints. The whole area has a rich history of Celtic Christianity from Llandaff Cathedral on the banks of the River Taff through to Llantwit Major which was once the site of Britain's first university and where the parish church of St Illtud has been a place of uninterrupted Christian worship for over 1,500 years.

The analogy of the water cycle from mountains to the sea and back again will help us to understand Celtic perceptions of circular time and will enable us to tune into the present moment where God can be revealed through nature, through imaginative prayer and through the people around us.
